ACADEMIC PROBATION REGULATIONS AND PROCEDURES

1. A student will be placed on academic probation if his/her cumulative grade point average (GPA) is below 1.50 over a minimum of 9 credits.

The student will be advised in writing of his/her status by the Registrar, and will be required to book an appointment with a counsellor by a prescribed date prior to registering. If the student fails to meet with a College Counsellor, their access to registration will be blocked.

The counsellor will meet with the student. The counsellor will also help the student understand causes of their academic difficulties, and problem-solving strategies for improvement. They will complete a Registration and allows registration for the upcoming semester.

2. Once the academic probation registration performance will be reviewed at the end of the next attempted semester.

3. If a student's GPA is above 1.50, the student will be taken off probation. However, if the student remains below 1.50 for a second semester, the student will be notified in writing by the Registrar and will continue on probation until his/her
